In Maryland, Jack served as one of the experts for all six officers criminally charged in the Freddy Gray case and testified on behalf of the wagon driver in his murder trial as well as his employment hearing. Jack has been consulted on several of the high-profile cases around the United States.

Jack brings a unique perspective to the high liability areas of law enforcement having been a defendant in a major case while an active officer; being an attorney who regularly trains other attorneys on these topics; as an expert witness; and as a national law enforcement trainer.
